Dr. Best most recently served as program manager for the Department of Defense Prostate Cancer Research Program where she led and managed a multidisciplinary team to execute on all aspects of an \$80 million appropriations budget for prostate cancer research. Dr. Best’s educational background includes a Bachelor of Science in Biology, Chemistry and Psychology from the College of William and Mary and a Ph.D. from the University of Maryland, with an emphasis in experimental pathology and cancer biology.
